

GRAD NIGHT FAQ: EVERYTHING YOU NEED TO KNOW ABOUT GRAD NIGHT 2022

WHAT IS GRAD NIGHT?

Grad Night is a fun, safe, and substance-free all-night celebration organized by RHS PTSA that starts on June 13th following graduation and goes until the early morning of June 14th. Transportation is provided to two surprise venues, entertainment, food and a memorable end-of-the year experience.

WHAT IS INCLUDED IN THE PRICE OF THE TICKET?

The ticket price includes transportation to two venues, food at each venue, and various types of entertainment for Seniors to enjoy!

HOW MUCH IS A TICKET?

The ticket price increases as the date for the party gets closer. Tickets are \$150 until May 1st. Tickets go up to \$175 on May 2nd. Last day to purchase tickets will be May 22nd.

HOW DO I PURCHASE A TICKET FOR MY SENIOR?

Tickets can be purchased online through the <u>RHS PTSA website</u> – see the Grad Night Party Info 2022 page under the Seniors tab for a link.

WHAT ARE THE OPTIONS TO PAY FOR A TICKET?

When you purchase a ticket online, you can choose to pay via PayPal or by check.

WHAT IF A SENIOR NEEDS FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE TO ATTEND?

Anyone needing financial assistance with ticket cost should see their RHS counselor.

WHAT IS THE LAST DAY TO PURCHASE A TICKET?

May 22nd will be the last day to purchase a ticket.

WHAT IS THE REFUND POLICY?

There are no refunds.

WHERE WILL THE SENIOR PARTY BE HELD?

The location of the celebration will be a surprise until the buses arrive at the venues.

HOW DO I GET A BUS ASSIGNMENT?

Between May 23rd and June 6th, Seniors who have purchased a ticket <u>and</u> returned the required release forms, will be emailed a Sign-Up Genius link to sign up for a bus. Seniors who provide releases after June 6th will be emailed the sign up after the release have been reviewed and processed by the Committee. Be sure to get those releases turned in before May 23rd to have the best availability!

WHAT TIME IS CHECK-IN?

Bus Check-In will begin at 9:30 PM at RHS. Please plan for a quick turnaround. **Food will be available at the first venue** at **11 PM**.

WHERE CAN MY SENIOR CHANGE CLOTHES?

Seniors can change at UW arena in the bathrooms or at their home. Plan to wear casual clothes with closed toe shoes. **WE WILL NOT BE ABLE TO KEEP PERSONAL ITEMS AT THE SCHOOL DURING THE PARTY.**

WHAT HAPPENS AT CHECK-IN?

Seniors check in by bus name. Personal items should be left with parents or at home. Students are searched by a same-sex adult before loading the buses. Release forms are signed again at check in, and any medications or food are processed by adult volunteers.

WHAT SHOULD BE LEFT WITH PARENTS OR AT HOME?

- Purses, bags, or backpacks
- Money
- Food and beverages (unless your Senior has a life-threatening condition and has made arrangements with the Grad Night Party Chairs)

If your Senior brings something that is not allowed, it will be placed in a zip lock bag and will stay with the Grad Night Party Committee. The Committee accepts no responsibility for any loss or theft of possessions, which are kept for the duration of the party.

ARE CELL PHONES ALLOWED?

Yes! This year, the committee has decided to allow Seniors to bring their cell phones to the event; however, cell phones will be confiscated if they are being used for inappropriate purposes (e.g., bullying, threatening, or harassing behavior; sharing venue location with others that are not attending the event and/or inviting or encouraging non-attendees to show up at the venue(s); taking inappropriate pictures with or without consent; etc.). Confiscated phones will be returned upon return to the school.

WHAT TO BRING TO CHECK-IN?

- Wear comfortable, casual attire (think gym clothes) and bring layers (t-shirt/sweatshirt)
- Please wear closed-toe shoes (they are required for some activities). Socks are strongly recommended.
- Emergency medical items (e.g., epi-pen, insulin, inhaler, etc.). These items will be allowed to be kept on your person if so indicated on the Emergency Care Plan. If your Senior has life-threatening allergies, we require a completed and signed Allergy Emergency Care Plan, which must be submitted to the Grad Night Party Chairs prior to graduation.

WHAT IF SOMEONE IS FOUND TO HAVE DRUGS, ALCOHOL, WEAPONS, OR A TOBACCO/VAPE PRODUCT ON THEM?

Senior Party is a safe event. There will be zero tolerance for tobacco, alcohol, drugs, or weapons of any kind. If prohibited items are found on a Senior at check-in, the Senior will not be permitted to board the bus. Seniors under the influence will not be permitted to participate. If prohibited items are found on a Senior at the venue, the Senior's parents will be contacted for pickup. NO REFUNDS will be provided for any of these situations.

WHAT HAPPENS IF YOUR SENIOR IS LATE TO CHECK-IN?

Anyone not checked in, searched, and on the bus by 10:00 pm will be left behind. NO REFUNDS will be given for missing the event.

WHAT TIME IS PICK UP AND WHERE?

Buses will return to RHS around 5:45 am on June 14th. Seniors will be tired and ready to go home! Because Seniors have stayed up all night, they are NOT PERMITTED to drive themselves home. We request that Seniors' rides be waiting for the buses by 5:45am on June 14th.

WHAT IF MY SENIOR NEEDS PERSONAL MEDICATIONS?

If your Senior takes medications that are needed during the event, you will need to indicate this on the Emergency Care Plan and check the medication in with the Graduation Party Committee representative at the time of check-in. Medications must be in a prescription container marked with the Senior's name. The medication will be placed in a zip lock bag, marked with Senior's name, along with assigned note by the parent with specific dispensing instructions. Non-emergency medications will be kept with an adult chaperone during the event.

WHAT IF MY SENIOR HAS A FOOD ALLERGY?

If a Senior suffers from food or beverage allergies, it is the sole responsibility of the Senior and their parent or guardian to determine if the Senior can safely attend the event, to determine what food and beverages to consume or avoid at the event, and to bring their own food to the event if necessary. The facilities or vendors supplying food and beverages for the event WILL NOT take any precautions in the preparation and service of food and beverages to protect against any food and beverage allergies. Peanuts and other allergen-producing ingredients may be used, and utensils may have come into contact with allergen-producing ingredients. Seniors with serious allergies should act accordingly and can bring their own food to the event. Food can be given to the appointed adult chaperone at check-in.

WHAT FORMS ARE NEEDED TO ENSURE MY SENIOR CAN ATTEND?

All Seniors must have the following forms completed and turned in before being allowed to sign up for a bus or attend the party:

- A Grad Party Release Form. The form should be signed by the Senior AND parent, regardless of whether
 the Senior is 18 already. Seniors will be required to re-sign the form at check-in to reaffirm their
 acknowledgment and acceptance of release.
- A COVID waiver signed by a parent and the Senior, regardless of whether the Senior is 18.

Any Senior with a food or beverage allergy or any medical condition needs to complete the Emergency Care Plan form and submit it before signing up for a bus.
